THE HISTORICAL SOCIETY was organized by Kansas newspaper editors and publishers in 1875 and soon became the official trustee for the state's historical collections. Since that time the Society has operated both as a non-profit membership organization (KSHS, Inc.) and a state agency (KSHS).
